The five most important overland trails to the West will be described, along with the reasons for choosing one trail over another, the specific seasons and challenges of travel along each, and what may be inferred about your ancestors from the routes they chose. Explore the fascinating, moving history recorded in trail diaries, online wagon train rosters, and other documents.

Kathryn Miller Marshall was the Director of the Lodi Family History Center for 14 years and now serves with FamilySearch, helping to program the Research Wiki. She is a frequent speaker at genealogical conferences and workshops. Dr. Marshall is a researcher on the

Advisory Board of the California Pioneer Heritage Foundation, which provides living history re-enactors at state parks and preserves historical sites in California. She writes curriculum for schools, books on early California history and the Gold Rush, edits books for historians, and creates replicas of antique maps.
